Literacy



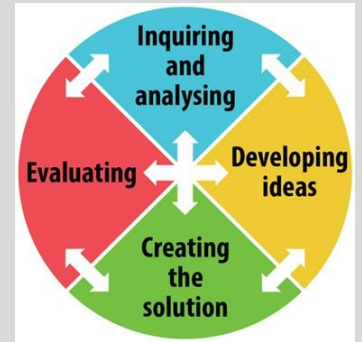
We are working hard to use comprehension skills to imagine and visualise what we are reading.

We love our new mat in 2/3/4! It clearly defines our floor sitting space and brightens up the room beautifully!

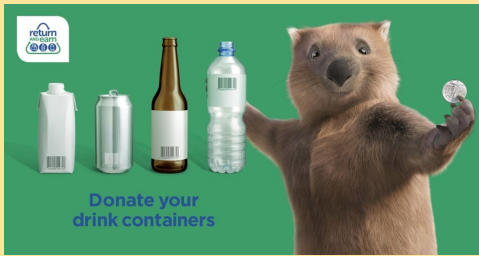
4/5/6
