<u>Literacy</u>: Our expectations remain clear and high for our teaching and learning of literacy at Repton Public. We have explicit teaching of reading and writing, speaking and listening in guided group sessions Monday-Thursday mornings. Our assessment data is showing that our students are becoming more successful using this targeted intervention. The use of individual learning goals has also made students more engaged in achieving high quality work across all grades. Well done both students and teachers in embracing this approach.

Numeracy: I had the pleasure of sitting in on number talks across all classes last week. How amazing to hear our students talking so confidently about a range of flexible strategies that they can use in mathematics to solve problems! We are attempting to shift a few mindsets of our students who don't believe they are good at Maths. We say "we are not good at solving problems this way...YET!" Growth mindsets coming your way!


