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Principal's Message

Attendance: A focus for our school this year has been around improved literacy and numeracy results, improved wellbeing and attendance measures, along with enhanced student and community engagement. In order to achieve this during covid limitations has been challenging in some areas. We will continue this focus in our plan over the next few years and hope your involvement can also be supported with activities and P&C events.

COVID ILSP: Ms Sue has been delivering intensive support to a range of students who needed some additional support with the COVID funding provided by the Dept of Education. Students have all shown growth with access to this tuition and we are seeing some gaps closing in learning. Level 3: We are still restricted at school with COVID-safe practices, face-to-face learning allowed but restrictions include mask wearing for staff, reduced mingling where possible, no singing, chanting, choirs, bands and school performances, no assemblies, no excursions, no community use of school grounds, no SRE or language programs. School canteen can operate.

<u>Sustainable Garden Gurus:</u> Our students have been busy preparing to showcase their knowledge of sustainable practices around the school. They have upgraded composting systems, added bird and bee attracting plants, designing new outdoor learning areas and water saving ideas. Thanks, Jimmy for helping complete these tasks.



Term 4– Week 1 - 4 -

The Proof - Justin's story

Justin had been introduced to books at six days old. It had seemed to his parents like a good thing to do – something a bit more interesting than just feeding him and changing his nappies – and he seemed to like books and being read to right from the start.

From day to day and week to week, his enjoyment of books grew steadily. By three months he clearly knew which way a book should be held, and he could even turn the pages on cue, responding to the obvious pause in reading at the end of a page. By three months!

Before long he began to develop favorites, most of which had simple rhyming words or the fascination of moving pieces. By six months he could identify many of his books by pointing to the title on the cover, and he was becoming more and more aware of tracking the print from left to right. Twenty little books in a one-hour sitting didn't make him flinch.



He was soon able to say two or three words together on a regular basis. He also attempted to 'read along' with his parents when they were reading to him and filled in the gaps they left out of certain sentences.

Read with joy and enjoyment

He knew his books virtually by heart. At twenty-one months this very young child had a speaking vocabulary in excess of five hundred words, which his mother attributed to what he had gained from books. He could also sight-read about twenty words.

This amazing information could send us into a compare-and-despair depression. But let's choose to be inspired, uplifted, and encouraged instead. After all, Justin's learning was coincidental. It had been fun. His parents didn't do anything super special with him, except love him, play with him, and provide him with plenty of books and the time to enjoy them.

Justin could be anyone's child: yours or mine, or the little kid next door. He isn't gifted. He isn't special. He's normal. But he does have an incredible blessing in his life: parent who read aloud to him!
