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Principal's Message

<u>Check in Assessment:</u> Check-in assessments are online assessment for students in Years 3 to 9. They are mapped to the NSW Syllabuses and National Literacy and Numeracy Learning Progressions. There are two assessments for reading and numeracy. The assessment can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. Students 3-6 will be participating this week.

<u>Hats:</u> As the weather warms up again, we are finding hats all over the school. Names on hats helps them get back to their owners. If your hat is missing, new hats are available for \$12.

<u>Breakfast:</u> Like all NSW public schools, we provide safe learning and teaching environments to encourage healthy, happy, successful and productive students. We have had a few students come to school hungry as they had skipped breakfast or were running late or had no breakfast at home. We have put a few cheese toasties aside for this occasion and would like to offer this assistance for students who need it. If your child needs a little extra, we can support this by enquiring at the office.

<u>Fruit break:</u> Crunch&Sip is a school wide initiative at a set time during the school day for students to eat vegetables and fruit and drink water in the classroom. Students should bring vegetables and/or fruit and a clear water bottle to school each day for the Crunch&Sip break. Giving students the chance to re-fuel with fruit or vegetables helps to improve physical and mental performance and concentration in the classroom, as well as promoting long term health.

Reading Aloud - And Do It Like This

Children who haven't been read to don't expect print to make sense. And if children don't expect sense, they'll find learning to read very difficult. When they try to read for themselves, they'll often read *non*-sense because they've never experienced the sense in written language – the sense of rhyming, the sense of stories, the sense of songs, the sounds of unusual words, the unfamiliar formal grammar of written sentences, and the way sentences work.

Children who have been read aloud to regularly do expect to make sense from print. They know about rhyme and rhythm and repetition. They know how real stories work, which makes it easier for them to read real stories. They can predict that certain words, patterns, and plots will occur, and they are proven right. Intention to apply for Year 7 placement in a selective high school in 2023

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2023, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 10 March 2022.

Detailed instructions on how to apply and the link to the online form will be available in early-October 2021 at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7.

Applications open on 19 October 2021 and close on 17 November 2021. You must apply before the closing date.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.
