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Principal's Message

The "Save our planet" topic has shown students becoming passionate and thoughtful in their entries. Finalists will be notified by the end of the week for each stage. <u>Musical:</u> We are in our swing of musical rehearsals now and are well tuned to the set needs and props for our scenes. We look forward to sharing this experience in 2 weeks!!

<u>Illness:</u> We have had a few students with illness recently. Please contact the office if your child is absent or unwell or send a note with your child to explain on your child's return to school. If they have flu like symptoms, please follow dept of health guidelines.

<u>School Captains:</u> On December 5th, Year 5 students are eligible to nominate themselves for Student Leadership 2022. All nominees will be required to prepare a speech that will be delivered at a school assembly. The speech will clearly detail why they should be elected school captain or student leader and how they will approach the role. Students in Kindergarten to Year 5 will vote. All staff will vote. Voters are required to tick, cross or circle the name of the person for whom they wish to vote. Votes will be counted by the coordinating teacher. The two students with the most votes will be elected School Captains for 2022, regardless of gender. The names of the students who will be School Captains will be announced at the Annual Presentation Day. At this ceremony the students will receive their badges and acknowledge their willingness to accept the position with the Captain's Pledge and Agreement.

Reading Aloud - "Book! Book! Book!"


It will do more for a child's literacy to own one much-loved, beautifully written, trouble-filled book than to own lots of tacky, unappealing books in which the child shows no interest. But any books that children own and love are good books *for them*.

One of my childhood favourites in the early fifties was a Little Golden Book called Scruffy the Tugboat by Gertrude Crampton. It certainly wasn't Great Literature, but it did have trouble in it, and it remains in print to this day. My heart still gives a little leap when I see the picture of Scuffy on the cover.

My dentist remembers a book called *A Pony for Tony* that his son loved to distraction. He had to read it to his son again and again, not skipping a page or a single word. The boy knew it by heart but still wanted it read aloud as often as anyone was willing to read it. The book apparently had very few redeeming qualities, but who cares? The child loved it and identified deeply with the character Tony, and that's what was important.

Identifying with the characters will draw children back to the same books often, for many unfathomable emotional reasons. Since we know that the repeated reading of a book is an important factor in literacy development, it's a huge bonus when children demand the same story again and again. Abd they'll make that demand if they like the characters, empathize with the characters, or see themselves in those characters.
