

Food Waste Facts

Every student wastes 3kg of food each year on average. In Australia each year, students throw away:

3.5 million uneaten sandwiches

3 million pieces of whole fruit

1.3 million items of packaged foods

Our school is participating in The Lunch Makers pilot program during Term 2.

We'll be exploring how we can reduce food waste by empowering students to be more involved in preparing and making their own lunch. We hope this will reduce the amount of food they throw away or leave uneaten.

We'll celebrate the students' new skills with a 'Make Your Own Lunch Day' in Week 8 this Term.

Starting this week, for all of Term 2, students will be empowered to make their own lunches as part of The Lunch Makers pilot. This program aims to:
