#### Principal's Message

<u>Mathematics:</u> Through the study of mathematics, students develop essential concepts and skills and apply them to deepen their understanding of the world. Our staff have been exploring the new syllabus and related content are organised in a new structure including Number and Algebra, Measurement and Space, Statistics and Probability. Within this area students will learn more deeply about working mathematically, communicating, understanding and fluency, reasoning, problem-solving. We look forward to learning more during the implementation phase next year.

<u>Swim School:</u> Next week we begin our 2 week Learn to Swim and Swim to Survive program. Please make sure you child has their hats, drink bottles and swimmers/towel with them daily. This program is a highlight for the students and a great way to improve water safety skills before the summer break.

<u>PBL:</u> Positive Behaviour for Learning at Repton Public involves explicit teaching around what Respectful, Responsible and Resilient behaviour looks like, sounds like and appropriate responses.

<u>Payments:</u> We recognise as the end of year comes many events and many payments are needing to be finalised. Thanks to those who have finalised payments. If you are finding difficulty in making any payments, please contact the office or make an appointment to see me to discuss options. We would prefer students didn't miss the opportunities due to finance, so please don't hesitate to ask.

Will your child be catching the bus to school in 2023? Applications are now open for a Bus Travel Pass. As it's a busy time of year, we highly recommend you make this application before the end of Term 4. It's also good to check the bus timetable to make your child's journey to school as easy as possible.

#### Here is how it works: Bus passes

All students catching the bus in 2023 will need a school travel pass.

Under the School Student Transport Scheme, eligible students can apply for free or subsided travel between home and school.

For more information about the School Student Transport Scheme and how to apply for a school travel pass, visit <u>https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/</u> from a desktop

computer. Applications for 2023 opened at the start of Term 4.

#### Bus timetables

Busways is the school bus operator that runs your schools' bus services. To find your child's school bus timetable visit the Busways website by using the following steps:

- 1. Go to <u>busways.com.au/nsw</u>
- 2. Click on 'school services' in the navigation bar and then proceed to 'school timetables'
- 3. Enter the school's name in the field that says 'enter a school name'
- 4. Select the school's name and the timetable should open on your device.

If you are unable to find or search for the school's name, use the drop-down menus on the same web page to find the school.

5. Once the timetable is opened, you will be able to identify which school bus services are available in your area for your child to use.

# COVID-smart measures for schools



Information for parents, carers and students

We know that being together in the classroom is the best thing for our students' learning, growth and welfare. This term we will continue to implement several measures to allow us to prioritise both the wellbeing of our students and a consistent and productive learning environment.

#### Stay home if unwell

- If your child is unwell, you must keep them at home. If they are displaying COVID-19 symptoms, they should take a COVID-19 test (PCR or RAT) and follow the advice from the NSW Government on managing COVID-19 safely at home.
- · Your child should only return to school when they are symptom free.

#### Vaccinations

- Vaccinations for COVID-19 and other viral illnesses are one of the best ways of protecting yourself, your family and the community. Vaccination is a safe and effective way to give your immune system a helping hand against many illnesses.
- All eligible students and staff are strongly encouraged to keep up to date with their vaccinations to
  protect their health.
- All staff working in schools for specific purposes (SSPs) are required to be double vaccinated against COVID-19 or hold a valid medical contraindication.



#### **Rapid antigen testing**

- Rapid antigen tests (RATs) should be used if your child is displaying COVID-19 symptoms.
- Students who test positive to COVID-19 are encouraged to notify their school and register their positive
  test results with <u>Service NSW</u> to have access to timely advice and support from NSW Health.
- Schools will maintain a reserve stock of rapid antigen tests onsite for surveillance testing purposes in the event of an outbreak.



#### Hygiene and cleaning

- Students are encouraged to regularly wash their hands with soap and warm water, and to use personal
  protective equipment as required.
- Boosted day cleaning of schools will continue on high-touch areas and other hard surfaces, door handles, lockers, light switches and handrails in stairways.





#### Ventilation

- Fresh air is the most effective form of ventilation to minimise the risk of transmission.
- During the warmer months, cooling will be used together with ventilation methods to balance thermal comfort.
- All learning spaces in government schools have been checked to ensure appropriate levels of ventilation and air purifiers have been provided where needed.
- · Using outdoor spaces will continue to be encouraged where possible.

#### Masks

- Mask-wearing is strongly encouraged where possible for all students, staff and visitors, particularly
  indoors and/or when physical distancing is not possible, and if they have been exposed to COVID-19.
- Mask-wearing is required at all times for staff, volunteers and other workers who support our students
  who are at greater risk of serious illness should they contract COVID-19, whether they be in schools for
  specific purposes (SSPs), support units or mainstream classrooms.

#### Visitors



- Visitors can attend school sites regardless of their vaccination status.
- Visitors who are engaging directly with students in certain higher-risk settings for school operations
  and curriculum delivery and allied health partners for the wellbeing of students, may be required to
  wear masks.

#### Activities

- Health and safety risk assessments will be integrated when planning activities, including excursions
  and overnight camps.
- Parents and carers will be made aware of the risk of exposure and will need to give permission for certain activities.

#### **Responding to local situations**

- Schools will work with the department's Health, Safety and Staff Wellbeing case management team to
  respond appropriately to local situations, including outbreaks of viral illness.
- In some cases, schools may temporarily introduce additional measures as a 'circuit breaker', including
  requiring mask-wearing, postponing or limiting non-essential activities and directing cohorts to learn
  remotely.



#### Learning remotely

 Schools continue to have access to digital, guided and printed learning resources to support students who need to learn remotely.

#### **Telephone interpreter service**
