Compulsory school attendance

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. *When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier, and your child will build and maintain friendships with others.*

The importance of arriving on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities.
- Give students time to say hello to their friends before class.
- Reduces classroom disruption.

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

WELCOME TO COUNTRY AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

There is an important difference between a Welcome to Country and an Acknowledgment of Country, although both are about recognising the land and paying respect to the Traditional Owners.

A Welcome to Country is performed by a Traditional Owner who welcomes visitors onto the land they are standing on. On my Country, only a Yorta Yorta Elder can deliver the Welcome to Country.

An Acknowledgment of Country allows visitors from the wider community to pay respect to the Traditional Owners of the land. It can be done by anyone, First Nations or not, on behalf of everyone gathered.

It is common in Australia for either a Welcome or an Acknowlegment – or sometimes both! – to be given before sporting, music and school events.
